

## **Transition of Care (TOC)**

Allegiance offers a Transition of Care (TOC) program that new clients can choose to provide for their membership. TOC is designed to support members who are receiving treatment for certain conditions during the Plan's transition to Allegiance, allowing for application of in-network benefits for covered services rendered by out-of-network providers for up to 90 days after the Plan becomes effective.

TOC is enacted to ensure continuity of member care in situations where provider disruption could cause a worsening of a member's condition, reoccurrence of illness, or interference with anticipated outcomes. TOC applies when a member is part of a new group and is receiving ongoing treatment from a provider who was in-network as part of the member's previous plan but is out-of-network as part of their new plan. In such situations, the member and/or provider may request a TOC exception.

## **TOC-qualifying conditions include:**

- Cancer under active treatment with chemotherapy and/or radiation therapy
- Organ transplant patients under active treatment
- Inpatient/hospital stays occurring on the effective date
- Ongoing treatment for acute injury or surgery with the past three months
- Pregnancy up to eight weeks postpartum
- Behavioral health any previous treatment
- Care related to end-stage renal disease or dialysis
- Terminal illness with anticipated life expectancy of six months or less



TOC requests are evaluated by Allegiance to determine if the member meets TOC criteria. If a member's TOC request is approved, they may continue to receive care from their current, out-of-network provider for the duration of the 90-day TOC exception period, with in-network benefits applying for covered services. In certain situations, our clinicians will also engage TOC-qualifying members in our Case Management program and assist in planning the transition of care to an in-network provider.
